This month's newsletter article will be a bit different from others that I've written in the past. Usually I tend to write about new sermon series or other topics related to the ministries of Salem and Siloa. But this month I want to address a topic that I have heard in congregation conversations in recent months. Therefore this message will be more about theology than ministry, and I pray you have an open mind about what I share. By no means am I requiring you to share this same theology as me, but I don't doubt that it will lead to some possible discernment on the topic.

It is no secret that we have a number of families in our congregations dealing with some really horrible news and situations recently. Whether that is directly in their immediate family or extended family members or friends. I will admit that Good Friday felt especially heavy for me this year knowing what was laying heavily on the hearts of my parishioners. While discussing the heartbreaking news we have been receiving lately, many people have been discussing God's role, or lack thereof, in these situations.

For whatever reason, our contemporary American theology has decided that "everything happens for a reason" and God is in control of it all - good and bad. And I think that is where some of these conversations are stemming from. However, I would argue that while God IS sovereign, what God orchestrates and allows is meaningful, significant, and purposeful. Or in simple terms, I personally believe that God ONLY produces life and love. Anything that is not life and love is not of God.

So if it's not of God, where does it come from? (We always want someone or something to blame, right?) I would argue that anything that is not life and love is of the devil and a result of our sinful world. I refuse to believe that our loving and gracious God is a God of disease, racism, terror, and the like. Some of these things are a result of our God-given free will, where we find ourselves with consequences that are based on our actions. But random diseases, for example, are not in God's plan.

Here's where I need you to come along the theological ride with me - the devil works REALLY hard day in and day out to try and get us to become skeptical of our God. When we discuss "God's motives" in relation to the terrible things that happen in our world, the devil is using us to plant skepticism in the minds of those around us (and even our own minds!). How many people have you heard of that give up on their faith during really difficult times? Seems like the devil won that one.

What would happen if during these conversations with family, friends, and neighbors, instead of spiraling into the dread of the negative, we look to where we can find the life and love that God offers and wants for our world. Instead of letting the devil win the conversation, "look for the helpers" as Mr. Rogers would say. Look for the ways that WE can be the love and life that our faith hinges on.

Sometimes bad things just happen, there doesn't have to be a lesson to learn from it, or a purpose to it. God is not testing you. God wants love and life for you. How can you be inspired in this season of resurrection to focus your mind and conversations on love and life as well? I know this may be difficult - many of you have spent many decades of your life with a certain theology and this is rubbing up against that. We also have many news outlets on all sides of the spectrum that want to promote the negative because that is what gets people worked up and ratings soar.

Instead of being dragged down in the abyss with the devil, be inspired to channel God's life and love in the world. God offers us a priceless gift of eternal life with God, and that should be our focus in the end. The devil works hard to keep us distracted from that resurrection hope. Let's use this growing season ahead of us as a season of growth for ourselves and our communities. How different can life be when the focus is on love and life!
