As we wrap up the summer and work our way further into the second half of the year, I figured it would be a good time to remind people about our Shalom Community Assistance Fund. I'm thankful for all the folks who volunteer their time at the Shalom Shop in Cambridge under Salem and Siloa's name and help to earn funds to help give back in our communities. They have worked hard, month in and month out, and we have a substantial fund built up at this point to help folks with their basic needs.

I'm not sure whether to be pleased that we haven't received many applications for assistance, or feel disappointed by that fact because I know there are so many people who are struggling with their daily living expenses and could be helped by this fund. I mention in conversations when I can to keep ears and eyes open for people who could benefit from this program and encourage them to apply.

We all live in different parts of the county and have different social groups we associate with, there should be a large reach and we could bless so many people who are struggling. A few months ago I sent out a letter to many of our Dalbo neighbors and did receive some applications in return, and we were able to assist those folks with some really important bills and expenses. I would rather see the funds be used rather than sitting in the bank account!

I also encourage members of our congregations to apply as necessary as well - this fund is to help ANYONE who is residing in Isanti County who needs assistance with funding their living expenses. I would love to support our members who are in need as well. Some examples of how we have given back to our community include food and gas gift cards, paying toward monthly rent or mortgage payment, paying on a medical bill, purchasing propane so tanks can be filled in the winter, as well as gift cards for clothing and school supplies.

There may also be other ways that we can use these funds within our county to support people that we haven't thought of yet. Organizations or non-profits that help to feed and house residents of Isanti County. If you know of any of these opportunities, let me know as well! Worst case scenario is our committee meets and says no, that particular request doesn't fit in the parameters of what the fund is used for. Who knows what sort of ways that we can continue to be a blessing in our communities!

I pray you have been having a wonderful summer - I had a refreshing vacation up north with my family and I have been so blessed by all the folks who have come on our county park walks this summer! They have truly been multi-generational events and we've had double digit attendance at every walk so far, which is simply amazing. I love seeing members from each church not only getting to know one another more, but also that they are inviting friends to come on the walks too - the more the merrier!

If you have been traveling a lot during these summer months, know that we have missed you and can't wait for you to get back to your normal schedule and join us in worship once again. Before we know it school will be back in session, which will mean Sunday School, Confirmation, Sparks, and Youth Group ramping back up again. So if you have kids in one of those age groups, stay tuned for more information about when those particular events will be starting!
