Greetings!

In September, you may remember that our sermon series reflected on ways we could Learn to Love our Enemies. Overall when we think of doing so, I'm sure we can find lots of reasons to believe that it is a very difficult thing to do. It's not at the top of our list, and it's something we would rather avoid than dig deep into. But then again, there are many aspects of the discipleship life that are difficult for us, but God still calls us to discern and try to live out to the best of our ability.

Another one of those aspects of discipleship that many want to avoid talking about or reflecting on would be stewardship. Especially in our current time when inflation and prices are high and it seems like our resources of all sorts, even our time, seem depleted. Instead of diving into the negative about our current economic woes and possibly ignoring speaking about stewardship all together, we will focus on it over four weeks in a series called Thriving.

Church pastors and leadership at all levels cannot ignore the challenge our church members face to be charitable, but also balancing burdensome debt, lifestyle maintenance, and limited retirement savings.

Our sermon series will have us step away from the false dilemmas and consider how our churches, our relationship with Christ, and we personally benefit from faithful stewardship. Sacrificial givers experience this when giving becomes disciplined and life balance is achieved and maintained. The more we have grace, lead by example, and speak to the joy of giving, the more new givers will thrive.

The Salem Stewardship committee has also planned for some temple talks as well as some coffee time conversation and activities to supplement this series. I look forward to hearing from congregation members about the ways they have found their time, talents, and treasures to impact their daily lives and their walk with

The one thing we must remember about stewardship is that all we have in life is not truly ours. We have been given the joy and challenge to steward all things in life to better our lives and the lives of others around us. We may sometimes get sidetracked by how we should be stewardship our time, talents, and treasures, but hopefully this stewardship sermon series can help you reflect on your own personal stewardship and adjust actions as necessary.

As we enter into October I look forward to a couple fall park walks, Dalbo Fire Hall Bingo(!), the Thank You Lord Dinner, Sparks and Confirmation starting, as well as continuing to enjoy ministry together in general.
