Last year during our mid-week Lenten worship services I utilized the resources of Lent in a Box from Church Anew, and I felt like they were well received enough for me to use them again this year! We will be moving from the book of Jonah to the book of Acts, and here's what the authors of the Lenten series have to say about our focus for this upcoming season:

Dr. Michael Chan and Dr. Eric Barreto write, "Lent is often a time of self-reflection, spiritual discipline, commitment, and community. Congregations gather to sing the minor harmonies of the way of Jesus on the road toward the cross. This Lent with Church Anew, however, we are going to look at a kaleidoscope of stories from the Book of Acts. We'll see the ways the Spirit alters our perspective, transforms our communities, and consistently blazes a trail ahead of us. We'll catch up with the work of the Holy Spirit, finding ourselves:

> Altered in Witness Altered through God's Creativity Altered on the Edge of Belonging Altered Alongside our Enemies Altered by Disruption Altered through Stories We Don't Trust Victory Altered

Because the Spirit is alive in, with, and under our ordinary lives, always calling us forward into transformation, nudging us into wholeness, and beckoning us forth into an alternative way." I'm so looking forward to this Lenten series for our midweek worship, not only because Dr. Chan and Dr. Barreto were a couple of my favorite professors from Luther Seminary, but also because the book of Acts is full of stories of what the early Christ followers were up to in trying to establish a new way of living out their faith in the world.

I pray we all learn a little bit more about how our lives are Altered by the Spirit as we journey our way through Lent. There will be worship held at alternating churches throughout the season, so make sure to pay attention to the Lenten schedule. But each Wednesday after Ash Wednesday (February 14th) there will be worship held at 1:00pm and 7:00pm, and soup suppers will begin those evenings at 6:00pm. Please consider signing up to help serve or provide food/supplies for the soup suppers as you are able.

Although it feels like we just completed the Christmas season, Lent will be here before we know it - and Easter will arrive even faster! I encourage you to enter into this season of Lent prayerfully and reflectively, tuning into the work of the Spirit in your life and within our churches. I pray through our worship throughout those 40 days that you will see how your own life is being Altered by the Spirit.


