Greetings!

In recent months our Wednesday afternoon Bible study has been watching a TV show rather than digging into the physical scripture together. We spent a great deal of time working our way through all four of the gospels, and now we're watching the gospels come to life as we watch the TV show "The Chosen." As you might recall, within scripture the gospels center on the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ – along with everything in between like his healings and teachings. Have you ever wondered what the lives of the disciples and those around Jesus were like? If so, I encourage you to tune into "The Chosen" as well!

Jesus isn't necessarily the main character in this series. Instead, we follow the lives of those surrounding Jesus: his disciples, various children, the religious professionals, just to name a few. The interpretation of scripture found within this series helps us view Jesus through the eyes of those around him.

What I've also enjoyed about this series is that it doesn't technically follow the gospel narrative chronologically like we're used to. There may be a main story they're telling each episode, but the writers have thrown in nuggets from other parts of the gospels as well as the Bible as a whole. It sometimes feels like a scavenger hunt to pick out the other story references as you watch.

The series has truly been a joy to watch, and we've only made our way through five episodes before we take our break during Lent. If you tend to find scripture a little dry or boring, you really should watch "The Chosen," as there is so much humor and compassion found in each episode, and it truly brings the Jesus story to life.

I encourage you to come watch episodes with us in person, we'll start back up the first Wednesday of April at 1:30pm, otherwise you can watch "The Chosen" many different ways - as long as you have internet and either a computer or smart device. It is available for free at www.thechosen.tv, by downloading either The Chosen app or The Angel Network app on your smart TV; many streaming services also have it included within their subscriptions as well.

As we enter into one of the holiest of seasons, try something new and make the gospels come to life on the big screen. Dive into the lives of those surrounding Jesus as they try to figure out who this mysterious man is and what impact he has on their lives. If you're interested in trying to watch these episodes but don't know where to start, come see me! I'd love to help you watch this wonderfully-crafted series soon!

Semi-Annual Meeting Update

Questions were asked at the Semi-Annual Meeting regarding Special Music and a 2024 Fish Fry. These items were discussed at the February Council Meeting and I want to update the Congregation on the decisions of the Council.



The Council consensus regarding Special Music, including Praise and Worship, is that a Music Coordinator is needed to arrange and schedule Special Music (including the Praise and Worship Team), or a Praise and Worship Coordinator to facilitate only the Praise and Worship Team. The Council is checking our current music license to ensure that Praise and Worship music is covered under the license. If you are inter-

ested in assuming the role of Special Music Coordinator and/or Praise and Worship Coordinator, please speak with Don Erickson, Worship & Music Committee, or Pastor Mary.

The Council discussed sponsoring a 2024 Fish Fry and decided not to host a Fish Fry this year. The number of individuals available to work and number of volunteer hours needed, lack of a chairman or co-chairs, and the 150th Anniversary dinner were discussed extensively. While the Council decided not to host, if there are Congregation Members willing to chair a Fish Fry and establish a committee, please contact Suzanne Hulett or Beverly Ramey, Discipleship and Fellowship Committee, or Pastor Mary.

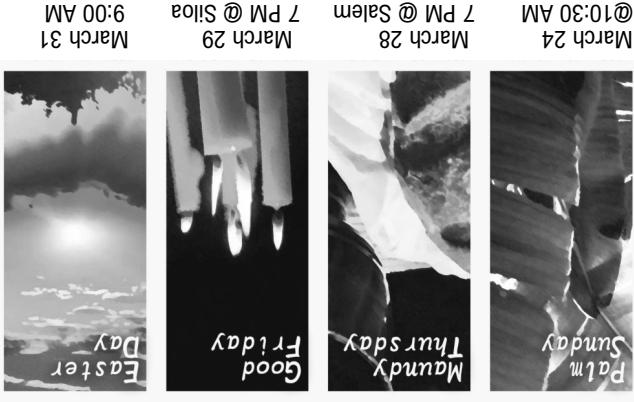
